#### Do I have to get the exact gift they requested.

No, however please choose each gift based on the suggestions compiled by the family. For many of these families, these gifts are the only ones they will receive this holiday season.

#### Can I contact the Family?

Absolutely! If you have any questions about their "gift suggestions," restaurant or store preferences, etc., feel free to call. Just tell them you are the family adopting them for Christmas.

#### Is there a deadline?

#### Do I wrap the gifts, and give gift receipts?
